Some of the highlights of our tour included meeting Spaghetti the young octopus, who gave us the most amazing display; we learnt that she has 9 brains! We caught a glimpse of Friday the turtle swimming with the incredible sharks, learnt how lobsters defend themselves, and watched the stunning jellyfish in their amazing rotating tank. I work for Devon County Council in the Education department dealing g with all the school census data and often help primary schools with their census returns in order to maximise their funding. One of the ways to increase funds for the school is through Pupil Premium funding.

I have been your Pupil Premium Governor and will remain so until the end of this term and wanted to say a little bit about that.

Pupil Premium is an extra amount of funding that can come into the school in various ways from the Government. The main way is via Free School Meal eligibility. If you think that you would be eligible for Free School Meals it is really important that you apply. The

At Highweek we empower every individual to aim high and reach further. Together we work in partnership with our community to help every individual develop the skills needed to embrace their future and to help them be well prepared for life in Modern Britain.

The purpose of the pupil premium grant is to enable schools to narrow the gap, ensuring that all children reach their academic potential no matter their starting point.

The grant can also be used to ensure that disadvantaged pupils have the opportunity to take part in a wide range of extra curricular activities: we subsidise residential trips and will be providing free lunch and after school sports clubs from September. You may be aware that we are aiming to facilitate one to one music teaching in school next term and if you'd like your child to learn an instrument, we may be able to subsidize some lessons. With this in mind, we will no longer be spending the money to provide a free jumper or cardigan at the start of each academic year for all pupils who are eligible. However, if you find yourself in difficulty and in need of uniform, do come and talk to us.

School Improvement

This week Miss Fran Lilley led the staff training on reading and the teaching of reading comprehension in particular. Reading comprehension strategies focus on the learners' understanding of written text. Pupils are taught a range of techniques which enable them to comprehend the meaning of what they read. These can include: inferring meaning from context; summarising or identifying key points.

Yesterday I had the pleasure of talking to some of our key stage 2 children about their learning. Some of our Year 4 pupils told me about their work on teeth and the digestive system and their experiment involving eggs, vinegar and orange juice.

Year 5 and 6 have been learning about the English Civil War and I joined in with their lesson about Oliver Cromwell: Was he a Saviour or a Usurper? I was very impressed by the level of engagement of the children, their knowledge and the vocabulary used. I now know what a Usurper is!

Bovey class had **100**% attendance for the period of 7th - 11th June 2021.

Taw & Dart class both had 100% attendance for the period of 14th - 18th June 2021.

We expect all children on roll to attend every day, when the school is in session, as long as they are fit and healthy enough to do so. There is a clear link between achievement and attendance and you can keep up with date with your child's attendance via the School Gateway app. We work closely with the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) and review attendance on a monthly basis, any pupils falling below our 96.2% target may receive a letter home highlighting this. We will continue to monitor their attendance and if there is no improvement we will invite parents into school to discuss how we are able to work actively together ensure a regular pattern is maintained. 


